HISTORY - MISSION - VISION

- The Library was established in **1887**.
- It is the country's first, and only remaining, independent library **dedicated solely to the subject of insurance**.
- The Library maintains a unique, comprehensive collection of insurance-related print and digital materials and insurance artifacts and memorabilia.
- But we are more than just a Library.
- The Library's **mission** is to provide members of the insurance, financial security, risk management, and legal communities, and the public, with high-quality **educational programming**, opportunities for **engagement and networking**, and unique **research resources and services**.
- The Library's vision is to be recognized as the preeminent nonprofit provider of such educational programs and other services, build upon our unique position as a hub for networking and engagement, and continue to expand our reach nationally.

KEY PROGRAMS & EVENTS

- Monthly continuing education webinars.
 - The Library is an **approved course provider** for producer continuing education in all six New England states (and is exploring accreditation in other states).
 - We offer unique **webinar sponsorship** opportunities for member organizations3.
- Custom in-person or virtual insurance education classes and courses with experienced, highly regarded instructors.
- Monthly Lunch & Learn or book Launch & Learn monthly virtual events.
- **Collaborations** for education or networking events with Social Law Library, Boston Chapter CPCU Society, Mass. RIMS, NAAIA, AAIMCo, InnSure, Insure Equality, and national service companies such as A.M. Best, Conning, Deloitte, Marsh, and others.
- As a **pro bono service**, we answer questions from consumers referred to us by the Massachusetts Division of Insurance.
- The **Nancy Z. Bender Award** is given annually to a member of the insurance community who excels at customer or community service.
- Our signature event is the **Insurance Professional of the Year Award Gala & Silent Auction**, where we honor annually an insurance professional who demonstrates outstanding leadership and exemplifies qualities that foster commitment to, understanding of, and respect for the insurance industry.

- Other recent or upcoming programs and events include:
 - Our popular **Summer Intern Program**, which includes education webinars geared to those new to insurance, an ice cream social, and a professional headshot event for member organization summer interns and early-career employees.
 - ESGi Scholars Program, in partnership with InnSure and Insure Equality.
 - Insurance Library Scavenger Hunt, a biennial event involving team-building and networking, peer-to-peer fundraising, prizes, a fun way for participants to learn about the history of insurance in Boston, and sponsorships that provide marketing and brand promotion opportunities.
